Burkina Faso : Gift of provisions to the internally displaced persons of Pabré

t the start of this New Year and in the wake of Christmas, the Community of Discalced Carmelites of Ouagadougou in Burkina Faso gave joy to the internally displaced persons of Pabré by sharing some provisions. This gift of provisions took place at St. Joseph Parish of Pabré, in collaboration with the

st. Joseph Parish of Pabre, in collaboration with the priest and the laypersons responsible for pastoral care of the internally displaced.

This symbolic gift of over two tons of rice and one hundred and fifty litres of oil marks the beginning of initiatives to assist those brothers and sisters of Pabré that have been internally displacd, where the Brothers are planning to construct their novitiate.

As at Dedougou, the Brothers are planning to begin gardening with some of the displaced persons, not only to give them an occupation, but also to introduce them to new methods planned for the agro-pastoral offensive desired by the President of the country.

This benevolent action was made possible by the appeal launched by Father General Miguel Marquez and the whole General House, so as to come to the help of the victims of terrorism in Burkina Faso.

South Korea: canonical approval of Uijeongbu Carmelite Monastery

n November 1, 2024, Uijeongbu Carmelite Monastery, located in Dongducheon, Gyeonggi-do, received canonical approval on July 3 of the same year, and celebrated its establishment with the Bishop of Uijeongbu and

with 300 people include 30 priests, 80 religious. Sisters from 10 communities of Carmelite Monastery in Korea gathered together to celebrate.

The Uijeongbu Carmel was founded by Carmel of Seoul, had a groundbreaking ceremony in 2006, but it was suspended due to various difficulties, but the monastery was completed in 2020 and now has eight perpetual professed sisters living together.



SENEGAL: 20 YEARS OF Presence in Keur Mariama

ith their celebration of St. John of the Cross, the Discalced Carmelites of Senegal gave thanks with their close friends for the 20 years since the creation of the site of Keur Mariama near Kaolack. The brothers arrived in Senegal in 2002, but it was 2004 when the Bishop of Kaolack took the initiative of creating this Catholic centre of 30 hectares, with a diocesan Marian sanctuary run by the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart; a propedeutic for the 7 dioceses of Senegal where the Carmelite brothers teach; a health centre; a centre for women's development run by the Theresian Carmelite Missionaries; and a spiritual centre of the Discalced Carmelites, which is used also for pre-postulate activities. After the Mass of thanksgiving and a shared meal, a video was shown that promoted appreciation of God's work, which has made possible the achievement of so much on this site in such a short time. May God be blessed, as well as all those who have contributed to the radiance of this site at the very heart of Senegal!





Wallis and Futuna: Foundation of the OCDS
