Funeral rites were celebrated on Sunday, February 3rd, in the Church of Carmel in Burgos.

## Father Silvano Giordano, consultor to the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints



On January 13th, Holy Father Francis appointed Father Silvano Giordano, Discalced Carmelite, as a consultor to the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints.

Father Silvano is from the Province of Genoa, has a doctorate in ecclesiastical history (Gregorian University, 1992), and is a professor at the Teresianum in Rome, where he also holds the office of Vice Dean (“Vice Preside”). Additionally, he is a guest professor of modern history in the Faculty of History and Cultural Heritage of the Church of the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome.

Professor Tiziana Maria di Blasio, who also teaches in our Faculty, was appointed consultor to the same congregation on that day as well.

## Extended Provincial Council for the OCDS province “FRANCE-SUD”



An extended provincial council meeting took place from January 12th to 15th with the participation of the OCDS Delegate General and the OCDS Provincial Delegate of the France-Sud province, fr. Jean Sebastien. The chosen location was the convent of the Poor Clares in Nîmes.

“The meeting enabled a clearer awareness of the state of the Province which was presented by the President, Mrs. Claude Garabiol, as well as the communities, whose councils provided information to the attending regional councillors and the provincial Council.

The OCDS Province of France-Sud covers a wide region of the French territory and includes three communities in Switzerland (two French-speaking and one German-speaking) and the island of Guadeloupe in the French Antilles.

Each region has a Councillor in charge of organizing formation meetings, retreats, and other events per the requirements of the communities. The Councillor also visits the different communities in his or her region to assist and accompany them.

During these days, the confreres have been able to fraternally share thoughts about their lay vocation in the Order and how to contribute to spreading the charism despite the few vocations, small size of the communities, and high median age. The Father Provincial, Fr. Henri, was also present in the meeting on the 13th, helping to solve some questions that arose regarding the main theme of the meeting: discerning the vocation to the OCDS.

## Saint John of the Cross in Egypt

**F**ather Eduardo Sanz de Miguel, Discalced Carmelite of the Iberian Province (Spain), delivered a series of conferences on Saint John of the Cross in the Shrine of Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus (Hadayek Shoubra, Cairo, Egypt) during the last week of January.

In the mornings he delivered a complete course to the Discalced Carmelites in Egypt, who were joined by the Carmelite Sisters “of Florence” and the Carmelite Sisters of Saint Joseph.

In the evenings he had the opportunity to meet with diverse groups of religious, families, and also had a meeting with priests.

The conferences were well attended and were a unique opportunity to transmit the Teresian charism and Sanjuanist doctrine to many Christians in Egypt.



## Meeting of European formators

Recently, between the 29th of January and the 2nd of February, a meeting of Discalced Carmelite formators took place. This year it was celebrated at the Teresianum in Rome. Its central topic was: “The world of the youth of today”. This topic was developed by means of three conferences, after each of which we then worked in groups and, finally, shared our conclusions in the Assembly. Giving the conferences were Fr Gianni Bracchi, Professor Dr. D Antonio Belleringreri, from the University of Palermo and Fr Maximiliano Herráiz.

During their stay, the formators also had the opportunity to get to know what the Teresianum had to offer academically as well as how the St John of the Cross International College functioned.

Taking part in the meeting were the Provincials who are members of the Steering Committee of the European Conference of Provincials, as well as Fr Agustí Borrell, Vicar General, and Fr Lukasz Kansy, Second Definitor, who discussed with the formators about the possibility of establishing a stage of “second novitiate” in Spain for Discalced Carmelites, to take place at the finish of theological studies, by means of which to encourage mutual knowledge and their training in the charism handed down to us from St Teresa and St John of the Cross.
